Welcome to the 2026 soccer season.

Registrations for junior players (U5 to U12) are now open.

Once you click on the registration link above you will log in with your existing Play Football account if you have logged in before, or create a new account if you haven't.

If you are not using the provided link, search for 'Taroona' on Play Football and select '**Taroona Football Club Juniors**' as your club. Then find the appropriate product:

- Taroona Football Juniors for Player Registration
- Volunteer Registration (for Team Managers and other volunteers)
- Coach Registration

You must click on all terms and conditions before you can proceed to the next screen. All the sections on the left must have a tick before you can complete the registration process.

The system will ask you to load a photo of the person being registered.

You will be asked to select the ID you are going to use for proof of identification, you won't be asked to present this.

Please do not request a refund through the Play Football system. If you encounter an error get in touch with me or call the helpdesk (details below) to check if it can be fixed. **Strictly no refunds will be given unless discussed with the club first, the club has no ability to issue a full refund for components that are paid to other organisations included in the overall registration fee.**

Ticket To Play

Ticket To Play vouchers can be redeemed through the registration process on Play Football. There is no other way to redeem them so please make sure you follow the correct process. If you commence entering your Ticket to Play information in your registration and you don't complete it you will lose the value of your vouchers. The club will not be able to do anything to get the value of your voucher back, it will be gone. Please don't commence the process unless you are going to complete it in one sitting.

Registration Date:

Please complete registration and Player Information Form for each child who will play in 2026 by **FRIDAY 13 MARCH** to enable enough time to put teams together and complete the team nominations by the closing date.

Season Dates:

The dates for this season are:

Rounds 1 & 2 (Opt-in) - April 11 & April 18

Grading Rounds 3-6 - May 9 till May 30 (Saturdays)

Rounds 7-10 - June 13 till July 4 (Saturdays)

Rounds 11-15 - August 1 till August 29 (Saturdays)

Hobart Cup - September 4-6

Taroona Football Club End of Season Celebration Day – September 12 (to be confirmed)

Training for teams will commence the week beginning May 4 and will finish the week starting 24 August. Teams opting in to the first 2 rounds can decide to commence training the week starting April 6.

Parent Coaches, Team Managers and Other Volunteers:

Each team will need a parent volunteer coach, a training session helper and a team manager. Please consider if you can take on one of these roles. A team may be deregistered if these positions aren't filled. Volunteers will need RWVP registration and will need to register via the links above on Play Football and upload a copy of their RWVP card as a .JPG or .PDF. All volunteers, including coaches will need to upload a photo of themselves. This is a FIFA rule. The club will provide training plans each week to support coaches with their training sessions. No previous experience in soccer is required. For those interested there are free and paid training courses offered through the season.

A volunteer parent will need to referee half of a match each week.

Note that the Tasmanian Government has recently made volunteer RWVP free of charge so if you are thinking about any volunteering now is the time to apply. It can take up to 6 weeks for applications to be processed so apply as soon as possible.

All volunteers must be registered on Play Football and provide WWVP details and a photo. There is no cost for volunteer registrations.

Team Training

Details for team training will be finalised once a parent volunteer coach is in place. Soccer balls and other training equipment will be provided to each coach. We strongly encourage all parents to attend the first training session to get teams organised.

Parents must ensure that their child is adequately supervised, whether by themselves or by another parent. This is not the coach's responsibility; they are there to coach.

Additional skills training is available on Monday, Wednesday and Thursday afternoons through the club. More information can be found here:

Team Uniforms

Players will need a Taroon FC orange skills shirt as well as black shorts and black soccer socks for both training and playing. The tops can be purchased through the club at a cost of \$38.50, or a club Junior Skills and Team Uniform Pack comprising the orange skills top, black Nike shorts and black Nike socks at a total cost of \$69.99. Club hoodies and club mid-layers (long sleeved top lighter than a hoodie), goalkeeper jerseys and gloves are also available on the same order form while stocks last but not compulsory.

Shin pads and soccer boots are essential and can be purchased from sports or department stores. Alternatively black shorts and black socks can be purchased through sports or department stores. Mouth guards are optional (but recommended) and can be purchased from a chemist, sports store or dentist.

Team Communication

It is a condition of playing for Taroon Football Club that all parents/guardians sign up to Stack Team App for all team communication. Teams may be deregistered if they are not using Stack Team App. For reasons of Club Safeguarding and to make it easier for volunteers the use of WhatsApp for team organising and communication will not be acceptable.

All team communication will take place through the Stack Team App which is available on the Apple App Store or Google Play Store. A team chat group for each team will be set up within the app and each parent will need to request access to their team. Team information and training cancellations will be communicated via the app so it is essential that all parents have it.

More information on setting up Stack Team App will be provided to all registered player families to make finding your team easier.

Rosters

Rosters for the season can be found on DRIBL. This is an app that can be downloaded from the Apple App Store or Google Play Store, or through a web browser. Once rosters are released more information on accessing rosters will be provided to all registered player families to make finding rosters easier.

Game Day

All games are played on Saturdays usually between 9am and 2pm. Games will be played on ovals around Hobart and further south. If your child is unable to attend a game you must let the team manager and coaches know via the team chat on Team App. Children should be at games ready to warm up at least 20 minutes before the game start time.

Game day cancellations are advised via the CRJFA website ([CRJFA – Central Region Junior FA](#)) and on the CRJFA facebook page, as well as on Team App in the team chat as soon as they are known.

Training cancellations will be advised on the TFC facebook page and on Team App in the team chat.

Player and Spectator Code of Conduct

Taroona FC encourage a positive environment during training and on game day. The emphasis is on participation and enjoyment of the game of soccer. Parents' actions at soccer are a direct reflection of the club.

Parents/family/friends attending games should enthusiastically encourage their children and the other team regardless of the score-line. They should appreciate and enjoy good play from all players. Excessive parent or player celebration of goals is discouraged – it is not respectful to the other team or a positive reflection of Taroona FC.

Foul language will not be tolerated by the coaches, Taroona FC or your school. Neither will parents arguing with, or abusing, players, game officials or spectators. Such behaviour may affect the child's registration.

The FFA have a spectator code of conduct that must be followed:

TFC has a great reputation for fair play, respectful treatment of other teams and courteous behaviour. This may not be the case with all teams that we encounter but is not an excuse to lower expected standards.
